The Diploma in Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) is a flagship one-year program of SIPD, accredited by Sindh Teacher Education Development Authority (STEDA) and affiliated with Sindh Board of Technical Education (SBTE). The first batch of 19 participants from public and private schools completed the program in August 2025.

A certificate distribution ceremony was held on April 15, 2026, at SIPD campus. Dr. Athar Mehboob, Vice Chancellor Al-Kawther University, was the Chief Guest. The event began with the Holy Quran recitation and Naat, followed by a welcome address by Ms. Naureen Faisal–Program Manager.

Diploma in Leadership and Education Management Approved by SBTE

The Sindh Board of Technical Education (SBTE) has officially approved the Diploma in Leadership and Education Management, a one-year professional qualification developed by SIPD. Prior to approval, the curriculum was validated by the Centre for Curriculum Research and Development (CCRD). Designed to prepare educational leaders, the program covers strategic planning, instructional supervision, school improvement, and financial management. Notably, this diploma is an original SIPD initiative, not an existing SBTE qualification. Its approval reflects SIPD's expertise in curriculum innovation and strengthens its commitment to providing nationally recognized professional development for educators in both public and private sectors.

The training covered useful topics like how children learn, multiple intelligences, lesson planning, inclusive classrooms, and working with parents. Participants took part in fun activities like role plays, group work, and planning lessons together. The Participants also visited the Topian Spirit Trust campus Rashidabad to see how classes were run there. They got many new ideas from the visit.

Continuous Professional Development (CPD)-Second & Third ICT Training Workshop at SIPD

SIPD organized the second and third batches of the ICT training workshop in May and June 2026 as part of its CPD program. A total of 31 teachers from both public and private schools in District Tando Allahyar participated in the five-day training.

The program aimed to enhance digital literacy through hands-on learning, covering Office applications—including Word, Excel, and PowerPoint—Google Classroom integration, PDF editing, and AI tools like ChatGPT, Copilot, and Gemini. Teachers also learned document formatting, data management, chart creation, slide design, hardware basics, and digital classroom management. With a methodology emphasizing 70% practical activities, the training included collaborative tasks, real-time demonstrations, and question-and-answer sessions.

Concluding with a post-test and digital project submission, the workshop successfully equipped teachers with essential IT skills for modern classroom management.

DEPD-SIPD Collaboration on Inclusive Education Teacher Training

In May 2026, SIPD organized a six-day training on inclusive education for public school teachers from Tando Allahyar and Mirpurkhas, in collaboration with Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disability (DEPD). All the participants were nominated by the DEOs. Out of 30 nominated teachers, 15 participated in the training.

The training covered many useful topics, such as inclusive teaching strategies, disability awareness, behavior management, child safety, teacher well-being, and how to create Individualized Education Plans.

For most teachers, this was a new and eye-opening experience. They realized that some children in their classes with mild disabilities had never been properly supported.

Mr. Qamar Shahid Siddiqui, Director-DEPD, visited and interacted with the participants. One participant shared how the training gave them hope and confidence to help a child with Down Syndrome in his village. The teachers appreciated the hands-on activities and practical guidance. The Director-DEPD also answered their questions about certification and future plans.

The participants found the training truly helpful and felt better prepared to make their classrooms more inclusive and caring for all children. Participants thanked DEPД and SIPD for organizing this meaningful training.

Math Circle Workshop



Math Circle Workshops for Students and Teachers – Tando Allahyar

In April 2026, LUMS, in collaboration with the STEAM Policy Unit SE&LD and SIPD, organized one-day Math Circle workshops in Tando Allahyar. The initiative sought to improve mathematics education through affordable, activity-based learning for both students and teachers. The first session, held from 10:00 am to 12:30 pm at Govt. Girls Higher Secondary School and Govt. Boys High School, engaged Classes 6–8 students in interactive problem-solving tasks designed to spark curiosity and deepen understanding.



A teachers' training workshop took place from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm at SIPD, drawing over 59 educators from government schools. Through hands-on games and practical demonstrations, participants explored creative teaching strategies that make mathematical concepts more accessible. The teachers responded enthusiastically and committed to bringing these methods into their own classrooms. They also appreciated the excellent facilities and support provided by SIPD. The workshops ended on a high note, reaffirming the value of collaborative efforts in fostering innovative teaching practices and supporting the ongoing professional growth of educators in the region.

MSP Team Visit to GBELS Tando Soomro for Paint Work Evaluation

In May 2026, the MSP team visited Government Boys Elementary School (GBELS) Tando Soomro to assess and estimate the paint work required for a specific portion of the school building.

It is worth noting that during last year's Repair and Maintenance (R&M) work at this school, a few classrooms in the old building were excluded due to their structural condition. Later, the Headmaster, after obtaining approval from the Education Works Department, carried out the repairs of the concerned portion with the support of the School Management Committee (SMC). Following his formal request, the MSP team visited the school to review the repaired area and prepare a work plan.

A Five-Day Capacity Building Program on Teaching English

A five-day subject-specific training on English was organized at SIPD from 20th to 24th April 2026. Twenty-one teachers from District Tando Allah Yar were nominated by the District Education Officer but only 13 attended. The program covered SLO-based teaching, textbook-curriculum alignment, reading and writing strategies, communicative grammar, and integrated skills. Participants engaged in group work, presentations, and microteaching sessions to enhance their pedagogical skills. The training also emphasized lesson planning, classroom delivery, and constructive feedback. Participants appreciated the content, delivery, and facilities at SIPD. Overall, the training was well-received and contributed meaningfully to the professional development of the attending teachers.



Mid-Term Examinations of ECCE-II Diploma Program

The Mid-Term Examinations of the Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE-Batch II) Diploma Program were successfully held at SIPD in May 2026. Conducted in a systematic and orderly manner, the exams assessed participants' understanding of the semester's course content. Participants appeared with seriousness and commitment, reflecting their dedication to professional growth. The assessment provided them with an opportunity to demonstrate their knowledge and practical learning. Overall, the examinations proceeded smoothly in a conducive environment, ensuring fairness, transparency, and effective evaluation of participant progress.



Orientation on Student Attendance Monitoring System

In May 2026, SE&LD, under the World Bank-supported SELECT Project, partnered with NADRA to conduct a two-day orientation on the Student Attendance Monitoring System and Redress Initiative for 43 teachers. The interactive session focused on leveraging technology to reduce student dropouts and enable data-driven decision-making. Participants gained practical understanding of the system, praised its effectiveness, and thanked SIPD for providing the opportunity.



ECCE Diploma Program – Module 4 Sessions

The ECCE Diploma Module 4 sessions were held on 3, 10, 17, and 24 April 2026, covering Curriculum and Lesson Planning, facilitated by Ms. Naureen Faisal, and Early Numeracy, led by Mr. Nadeem Qureshi.

Participants explored child-centered lesson design, activity-based math strategies, and hands-on approaches. Through group work and practical tasks, they reflected on classroom practices and gained actionable strategies to foster engaging, holistic early childhood learning experiences.



Webinar on Home, School, and Community Relationships

An online webinar on Home, School, and Community Relationships was held on 24 June 2026 for ECCE Batch-2 participants and educators.

Conducted by Ms. Naureen Faisal-Program Manager, the session drew 45 of 71 enrolled attendees.

It emphasized fostering strong family-school-community partnerships to enhance children's holistic development and learning outcomes.



Capacity Building Training for Non-Formal Education (NEF) Teachers

In June 2026, IRC, in collaboration with SIPD, organized a three-day training for 40 Non-Formal Education teachers, supported by GPE, UNICEF, and SELD. The program focused on activity-based methodologies, digital skills, and community engagement to support out-of-school children, especially girls. Participants engaged enthusiastically, appreciated the practical sessions, and committed to applying new strategies. They thanked IRC and acknowledged SIPD's excellent facilities and management.



Awards Distribution Ceremony: ProSCA Level-II and Elite Rehab Level-II courses at Alkawthar University
